Project Overview

The Oregon legislature has allocated \$50 million from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to construct wastewater improvements in the North Santiam Canyon, including a joint sewer system between Gates and Mill City. This project includes a new sewer collection system in Gates that will transport wastewater to Mill City, and a new wastewater treatment plant in Mill City to serve both communities.

Surveying and field work is expected to begin in the summer of 2024. Gates sewer connections will become possible in 2026 or 2027.

2022

The Oregon legislature allocated American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for the construction of wastewater improvements in the Canyon.

2023 - 2024

Engineering design, permitting, and construction plan development.


2025 - 2026

Construction of a new Mill City wastewater plant and sewer main from Gates to Mill City. Construction of new sewer mains in Gates.

Mid/Late 2026

Gates sewer connections will become possible as the new wastewater treatment plant and sewer main between Gates and Mill City come online.





What should I do with my septic system?

For the protection of our water resources, privately-owned septic systems must continue to operate until the new sewer system becomes operational in 2026.

Repairs to existing (or previouslypermitted systems) may have less stringent permitting requirements. Contact the Building Inspection department in order to address these on a case-by-case basis.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why is the Mill City sewer plant being replaced?

The existing plant is over capacity and lacks the necessary treatment to meet current permitting requirements for the North Santiam River basin. The new wastewater treatment plant will provide enough treatment to meet Mill City's needs plus offer sewer services to Gates.

What will my monthly sewer bill look like?


A rate study is underway to determine what future sewer rates may look like. Sewer rates will be based on the projected cost to operate and maintain the new sewer system. Initial rate estimates are expected in 2024. The good news is that construction of the new sewer system is grantfunded; rate payers will not be expected to pay for the cost of building the new sewer system.

When is construction going to happen?

Construction is expected to begin in 2025, including construction of sewer mains within Gates. The new sewer system is expected to begin operation in 2026 or early 2027, which is subject to change as design and permitting progress.
